Thankfully we've got our wish. Getting through the challenges presented by the global pandemic hasn't been easy for any charity, ours included. Taking the difficult decision to close our doors during lockdown meant, like so many people in our community, our income was badly hit.

However, we've come through the darkest of times and can now look forward to the future and a much brighter 2022.

The Trust's finances are on a solid footing and that has been noticed by a number of grant-making organisations who are backing all the good work the Trust does in our part of the world with cash to support us.

One notable side effect from COVID 19 has of course been a huge surge in holidaymakers visiting our corner of Northumberland. The tourism boom has seen a welcome increase in turnover for Seahouses Luxury Linen, the linen hire business we run from The Hub.

Each month more holiday home owners and B&B businesses are signing up to rent the sheets, towels and pillowcases they need for their guests from us — not just because our prices are a really good deal, but also because they know every penny we earn from the business goes back to help fund the community projects we run.

And bit by bit people are getting back into the habit of popping into the Hub to enjoy all that we have to offer. So we've got the Mature Movers group once again doing their workouts on Mondays – the tea, biscuits and chat afterwards perhaps just as much an attraction for some as the actual exercise.

Tuesdays sees the Hub busy with craft sessions and the creation of traditional proggy mats. While the next, and always popular, Bell View fish and chip lunch will be held on Tuesday December 14. Call in or ring us to book your place.

On Wednesdays it's the turn of those seeking help from an expert with their laptops, tablets or mobile phones at our IT Drop In session to be raiding the biscuit tins here at The Hub.

While on Thursdays there is a good old fashioned coffee morning organised by our friends from Bell View.

The Parkinson's UK charity, which works to help those affected by that condition, are about to launch a monthly support group and the numbers attending our Youth Project events are rising week by week.

Much of what happens at The Hub is aided by willing volunteers, the people who give up their spare time to sort out our library every week, change the lightbulbs, give the place the odd lick of paint where needed. We won't name them, but they know who they are and how grateful we are for their help.

But guess what? Right now we are on the lookout for some extra volunteers to help out on our cinema nights. You might find yourself dishing out tubs of popcorn, pouring wine, showing people to their seats or clearing the seats away after the movie. One guarantee, you will get a very warm welcome and your contribution will be hugely appreciated. You'll also get to see that night's film for free.

Seahouses Youth Project

Here at Seahouses Youth Project we have been very fortunate over the years with some amazing funding. This has given us the opportunity to run a weekly youth club with lots of fun, challenging and educational activities. Youth club is aimed at school years 4,5 and 6 and runs on a Tuesday evening. Come and see our life size Christmas ginger bread house in the entrance to The Hub.

Now its only fair we have something for the older ones as well so in September we started our Young Adventurers this group is made up of 13 to 18 year olds, we have a mix of conservation sessions and outdoor activities. We aim to build confidence in our Young Adventurers while encouraging them to try new things, show commitment to the group and have fun while doing it. Our group should finish at the end of the year with first aid experience, a navigation award, and a John Muir certificate at the least. Then we welcome them back the year after to follow on where they left off to aim for the next level of these awards or to try something totally different again.

This project is free of charge for the young people. The project is currently funded by a grant from the Willain Trust and we have been fortunate to be picked by the COOP local community fund to receive funding to help our Young Adventurers to carry on next year as well.

To help us we are urging local COOP members to pick us as their local cause, this will help local children in the area to carry on being able to join in with activities such as canoeing, hiking and conservation activities including learning about what Northumberland national Park rangers do down to local conservation sessions on removal of invasive species. Following this years Harvest Festival and the generosity of the congregation of Seahouses Methodist Church, Richard and Anne Sanderson were delighted to deliver no less than 13 overflowing 'Bags for Life' full of groceries to the local Foodbank in Alnwick. Treasurer Deborah Barker and Trustee Christine McElhone were on had to receive the donation.

Richard reports that they were then kindly given a guided tour of the facility and learned first hand just how much such donations mean to the recipients. Sadly as a result of Covid and its aftermath even more people are now locked into poverty with on average as many as 47 local families or individuals being grateful to receive the weekly provision of food parcels.

Nationally the Trussell House Foodbanks have sadly increased in number over recent years to now number over 1,300 plus another 900 independents, one of which is Alnwick. Richard went on to say "In addition to the churches donation, our congregation also offered prayers and grateful thanks to the volunteers who man them, to the people who so generously and regularly support them but most of all to the people who regrettably require them"

A more sedate activity 'carpet bowels' has seen a welcome resurgence of new members.

Whilst the lawns are closed to croquet players, during the winter months, the Mexican trian dominoes in 'the middle' provides a chance to keep in touch with fellow croquet members and the regular Mah Jong sessions also stretch 'the little grey cells'.

Behind closed doors the many committees of differnt organisations are planning their programmes for 2022 with a view that we will all with great care, safely, start to regain normal village life again.

Everone is raring to go and the joy of getting 'out and about' both near amnd far is giving Bamburgh folk a feeling of optimism for the year ahead.

The Team received an amazing cheque donation of £2669.27. The Lights team was set up in 2002, following a discussion in a local inn beside the harbour, where concern was expressed at the lack of Christmas cheer then in the village. Experience and expertise has developed since then, and a firework display is usually included on Christmas or New Year's Eve, to compliment the lights, which have proved quite a tourist attraction.

Team Chair Ian Clayton added, "The Team operate on quite informally, and I would like to thanks all of the volunteers for their hard work. We are still looking for volunteers to help us, and anyone interested should contact the Olde Ship Inn at Seahouses. We are delighted to be chosen by the NE Co-op for this donation from their Community Fund, which will certainly help support the project which has been financially affected by the pandemic, like many others. The display this year, had been slightly reduced as it was last year, but is still hopefully very effective in promoting Christmas. Next year we hope to restore some of the building features, and reinstate other pre-covid financial support. Although the lights are costly to buy and maintain, they hopefully boost our tourism industry, and bring some Festive Cheer to the local community, which makes it all worthwhile!"


