

An Optimistic Bamburgh 2022

Bamburgh village is anticipating exciting and active months in 2022 as the mornings get lighter and sun rise seems just a little brighter and earlier. Organisations based in Bamburgh are preparing their weekly/monthly programme of events for the year and there is certainly a lot to look forward to.

The Pavilion, recognising the Covid restrictions, is once again a hive of activity with weekly group meetings starting up again and the monthly Northumberland Bird Club and Bamburgh Women's Institute meetings offering excellent speakers on subjects such as bird life, travel, music and much more.

Although the Grove in the centre of the village is still looking devastated by the storm perhaps the tree damage has had a positive effect on the ground beneath the tree canopy as light can penetrate more easily and the flora beneath the trees given space and light to florish and grow. Unfortunately because of the heavy vehicles, needed in the Grove to lift the felled trees, the snowdrops, crocus, daffodils and primroses will have been ploughed under their huge wheels but hopefully they will eventually recover and rise again. The salt laden ferocious wind has burnt a lot of the foliage on shrubs, plants and trees so this year's early blossom, providing nectar for the bee population, will be greatly depleted in gardens and public places. Bamburgh beach continues to be a source of great enjoyment for dogs, walkers, and sea activities. The beach during lock down and Covid restrictions a place to head to for all those needing a breath of fresh air with landscape views and on cold days a well earned rest at one of several external coffee stops offered in the village. The Coast Book club, based at Seahouses Hub, with membership from Bamburgh, Seahouses, Beadnell and Amble continues to meet monthly to discuss the books they read each month. The club is greatly indebted to the Hub for providing members with a safe and comfortable venue for their much enjoyed and thought provoking meetings.





2022 has already been a busy year for Wildlife Rangers Richard and Katherine! We have been out on the coast talking to local residents and visitors about the incredible shorebirds we are lucky to have here in Northumberland.

With winter beginning to draw to an end and spring creep ever closer, the birds are starting to prepare for their long migration to their breeding grounds in Scandinavia and Greenland. For this journey they must feed as much as they can to keep their energy levels high, so it is therefore important that if you see a group of shorebirds feeding or resting, please give them space so they do not waste any of their precious energy flying away from unnecessary danger – energy which they desperately need to survive.

Before the birds leave, we are running Shorebirds for Beginners events at various locations for those interested in learning a bit more about the lives of the birds and want to pick up a few tips on how to identify them, such as bill shape and distinctive behaviour.
