Timely Garden Tips. August and September 2022

The second week in August generally sees a subtle change in the weather to cooler autumn days.

Now is the time to order, buy, plant or store bulbs. Keep in a cool, dry spot if not planting until the autumn. They can go in pots or popped in the ground ready to surprise you on a sunny day in Spring.

Try taking semi ripe cuttings of plants that are unlikely to survive a hard winter like Salvia or <u>Osteospermums</u>. Cut preferably nonflowering shoots to pencil length. Take off the top growing tip of the stem. Trim to under a leaf node and remove the bottom $2/3^{rd}$ of leaves. Place 4 or 5 cuttings around the edge of a pot of compost, water and keep on a windowsill or in a frost free porch or garage windowsill over winter. Free plants for next summer!

Consider installing a water butt to collect autumn rainwater from roofs. This is particularly good for watering ericaceous plants like camellias and rhododendron which are currently producing flower buds for next year. All houseplants, especially carnivorous ones, prefer rainwater but allow it to come to room temperature before using. Northumbria Water currently have discounted offers for water butts from £35 including delivery. Stop annual and bedding plants from running out of steam by deadheading and feeding regularly, weekly if possible. Tomato feed is fine or any liquid feed. Follow the instructions carefully as too strong a feed can be as bad as none at all.

If you are growing wallflowers, pinching out the growing tip encourages them to make side shoots and bushier plants.


September is a good time to trim evergreen hedges to keep them looking good over the winter.

Collect seed from annuals and perennials on a dry day. Extract seeds and place in a labelled, paper envelope. Store in a cool dry place over winter. They may not all be identical to the parent plant but some may be an improvement.

Trim flowering shoots from lavender plants to prevent them getting too tall and woody. But don't cut hard back into old, brown wood.

If your flower beds are looking boring treat yourself to autumn flowering perennials such as asters, penstemons, crocosmia or sedums to improve it for years to come.

September is a great time to lay turf but prepare the ground well first.


