### Timely Garden Tips. June July 2022

- As well as just enjoying your garden, there is still time to sow some seeds. Cosmos, marigolds and sunflowers will all flower if sown before mid June. Sow in modules rather than open ground where they have to compete with weeds. Runner beans, beetroot, lettuce, and spring onion seeds will be successful too. Spinach sown after the longest day is less likely to 'bolt' (run to seed).
- If your seed packets are out of date check viability by sprouting a few on wet kitchen paper first.
- July is the time to sow bi-ennials which grow over autumn and winter then flower next year. Foxgloves, Honesty, forget me nots, sweet william and aubretia all grow well this way if sown in modules, potted on and planted in their final positions in October. Wallflowers are traditionally sown, thinly, in a spare piece of earth, then lifted and moved in the autumn.
- You can also successfully Prune in June (or July) Cut back all growth on early flowering Hardy Geraniums, perennial poppies, foxgloves and astrantias to 2 or 3 inches when they start looking tired. Water and they will regrow. This stops them seeding and you may even get more flowers later.
- Cut off all strawberry runners unless growing some new plants.
- Deadhead roses to the first leaf. Feed and water after the first flush of flowers to encourage more.
- Shear back overgrown Clematis Montana after flowering to keep it in shape.
- Remove any shoots on variegated shrubs that have reverted to green.
- Cut back to ground level up to one third of flowering stems on established shrubs which have finished blooming.
- For a quick improvement to the garden cut the lawn edges.
- Pick ALL sweet pea flowers for the house or compost and, for a longer crop, feed with tomato feed every 2 weeks and keep watering.

**SEAHOUSES STAR**

On Sunday 1st of May this year, 22,134 fans filled the East Stand, the Leazes End and the Gallowgate end of St James's Park, Newcastle to watch Newcastle United Women's Football Club play their inaugural match at the venue. It was quite an occasion, the crowd unexpectedly large — so much so that kick off was delayed for 15 minutes whilst fans squeezed through the turnstiles having formed well mannered and wiggly queues filling the ground's apron.

Flags waved and the atmosphere was abuzz before a very loud cheer and rousing roar greeted the players, the noise frightening younger children in the family enclosure. And the opponents facing up to the club backed by an organisation reputedly worth £320 billion? It was none other than our local team, Alnwick town WFC. Many a youngster dreams of playing at Saint James Park, Newcastle and so few realise that dream: but the dream did come true for Seahouses born and bred Kirstie Tang.

I asked Kirstie after the game what it was like to walk out in front of 22,000 people. "Loud," she said and "very loud" during exciting points of the match. I wondered if Newcastle United WFC provided tough opposition but "similar to other opposition in this league" was the reply. The ground *was* something special however, "the pitch was like a carpet, easier to play on" and the facilities "top class". Kirstie reflected on the progress women's football has made recently and contrasted there being "no teams when I was younger" with the chances current players have.

Alnwick put up a solid fighting performance and did themselves proud despite losing 4–0. They have been promoted two years running, and are now playing much tougher opposition. According to my octogenarian father, who like many of his era, were fine players in the day and are now *experts* on the technical side of the game, there was a lot of skill on display from the women who play 'proper football'. We had a top family day out: thank you Seahouses Primary School for the tickets and a super big congratulations and well done to our Seahouses star Kirstie Tang for representing our village and Alnwick WFC at this truly historic event. Why not go and support Alnwick town WFC next season? You are guaranteed entertainment and 'proper football' :-)



Anyone passing the Bull Ring recently will have spotted that our tipsy pine trees have been returned to the vertical. Many thanks to all who came to their aid including Peter, Gordon and Duncan for their confident tree-wrestling and the Mellor family who supplied and operated the heavy equipment. New supports around the trees should reduce the impact of the next storm and help keep little hands off the Christmas lights.

We have been grateful for the gift of top soil to enrich the beds around the benches; this will give the freshly planted lavender a good start. Fingers crossed that the reduced footfall at the Bull Ring bus stop means they get growing before being trampled.

The end of May is really busy; we will be trying to get the winter plants out and the summer plants in before the Jubilee weekend. It would be nice if it rained so that carting water could be taken off the "to do list" but not at the same time as all our celebrations! Look out for some bargain plants on the Stall on the Wall which is up and running again thanks to the hard work of The Browns.

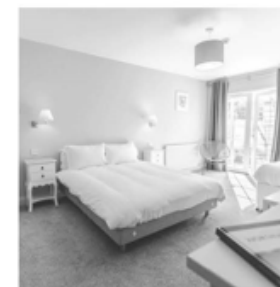

### Space for Shorebirds

It has been a very busy few months for us as shore nesting bird season is well underway! With the help of our dedicated ringed plover surveyors from Coast Care, we have been monitoring the progress of nesting ringed plovers and protecting their vulnerable nests from disturbance and accidental trampling.



We have been overwhelmed by the support we have received for the ringed plovers so far this year as they really do need our help to have a successful nesting season – their population is declining rapidly and they are red listed for conservation concern.

So far, we have created nest protection areas in locations including Beadnell, Newton-by-the-Sea and Embleton, and one easy way to help protect the nesting birds is to give space to the fenced off areas and keep dogs close to you so that the birds are not disturbed. If they feel threatened, they will move away from their nest, potentially giving away their presence to a lurking crow or kestrel which would not hesitate to make a quick meal from an unattended egg or chick.
