



Christmas present ideas for Serious Gardeners.

Free - Bags of well-rotted manure may be hard to wrap but will be welcome in most gardens. The best compost bins are made from pallets, especially if lined with off cuts of insulation or inside out compost bags stuffed with leaves. Home-made presents are always welcome and if you are good with knitting needles, wrist warmers or a cosy neck cowl make winter gardening tasks more bearable. Homemade bird tables and bird boxes are cheaper and usually more substantial than shop bought. The latter need a lift up lid or removable back for cleaning and a metal plate to surround the entrance to stop woodpeckers raiding the contents. These plates cost a couple of pounds on the internet.

Under £5 – Gardening gloves but not thin floral cotton ones please. Showa make a range of gloves for factory workers. Showa 451 is thermal, fleece lined and keep hands warm in winter. Showa 370 lightweight are made for assembly work so are ideal for weeding and continuous wear. Washable too. Available online.

Under £10 - Kent and Stowe make sturdy Gardening Scissors which will cope with a range of tasks from cutting thin branches to edging your lawn. Available from Cowells Garden Centre for £9.99

Under £20 - Gardeners who feed the birds will appreciate free standing bird feeding hooks or Feeding Stations. These don't last forever and often need replaced. Different types of bird food is always welcome, but please not the cheap stuff full of grain.

Under £30 - Garden ornaments are difficult to get right but a narrow metal garden obelisk will serve to support climbers or sweet peas, provide a screen from neighbours or act as full stop in a border or view. They are easily moved and last for years. Under £50 - Good quality Peony supports can be used for outdoor tomatoes and many other boisterous plants. The bigger it is and the more legs it has the better. Don't, ever, buy flimsy easy to bend plant supports. The clue is in the description.

Under £100 - I received an electric Hydropod Cuttings Propagator from Santa and enjoy seeing numerous softwood cuttings grow roots in the matter of days. The stems are continuously sprayed in water (no need to add feed) until they root. They then need to be potted on carefully and perhaps kept covered for a couple of weeks to harden off, but it makes cuttings child's play. Don't forget to keep a chart of what cutting is where and when it was added. It's far too easy to forget.

Over £200 - For serious presents a Hot Bin devours newspapers, garden and all your food waste, even meat and bones and produces rich, weed seed free compost in a matter of months. Takes some getting used to, the secret is equal amounts of brown and green or wet and dry waste but it can be filled to the top every week at least. I wrap all my food waste in newspapers and that works well. Rodent proof, no smell and neat to look at, the 200lt size currently costs £300 but mine has lasted 12 years so far and is still going strong.







Chathill Station

As many people will know a small railway station exists at Chathill. In the distant past a good number of trains called at the station and served various destinations both north and south.

In recent years there have been two trains per day to/from Newcastle which call at all stations and take around one hour to get to Newcastle.

A campaign has been launched to lobby Northumberland County Council to ask the passenger rail operators to stop more trains at Chathill and to offer more destinations.

Whilst in the long term (six years plus) it is hoped that a station will be built at Belford (and a better train service introduced) this campaign is asking for more trains next year to call at the existing Chathill station.

At present there is no bus link to Chathill and Northumberland County Council would be asked to support a connecting bus link if additional trains are to stop at Chathill.

As part of the campaign, which is supported by <u>Bamburgh</u>, North Sunderland and <u>Beadnell</u> Parish Council's, a questionnaire has been produced to gauge future usage.

It would be much appreciated if this could be completed prior to a meeting with Northumberland County Council's Cabinet Member for Transport.
