

The North Northumberland Bird Club

Founded in 1984, we meet for talks on the second Friday of the month from September to June in Bamburgh Pavilion. Our speakers are both local, Tom Cadwallender for example, and national figures in birding such as Dr. Ian Newton, an academic and author of many articles and books. The speakers take us to places such as Arizona and Australia and examine issues such as the decline of the curlew and the impact of farming on bird species.

As well as the talks we have a varied field trip programme that includes visits to reserves such as <u>Saltholme</u> on Teesside, local places such as St. Abbs and <u>Aberlady</u> Bay and even further afield to Yorkshires and Bulgaria for residential trips.

Members can send their sightings to the club recorder and these are then passed onto the Northumberland and Tyneside Bird Club to help build a picture of bird life in the County.

A Facebook page and club website allow members to contribute stories and photographs as well showing the latest happenings in the birding world. They also have information about the club's programme of talks and field trips.

FROM WHERE I SIT

In the last edition of Village News, I wrote how I tripped on an upturned paving stone outside the Upper Building of the Alnwick Medical Group and fell flat on my face, on 4 June. I had a broken left arm with a modern cast and, then, a lighter splint on until 5 August.

On 5 August, having been discharged by both the Consultant and the physiotherapist, I was able to drive again and celebrated by having two short breaks with my sons and their families in Tynemouth and Harrogate.

On 13 August, whilst driving home to Seahouses, I felt unwell and called into the walk-in Urgent Care Centre at Wansbeck Hospital.

I learnt that I had had 'heart failure' and was rushed, in an ambulance, to the Specialist Emergency Care Hospital in Cramlington. After two days there, I was transferred to the Cardiology Ward back at Wansbeck Hospital.

So, after almost a lifetime of no experience as a hospital in-patient and very little as an NHS out-patient, 2021 has been a real and extremely positive revelation!

Eventually, on 28 August, I was discharged. Another NHS adventure in two months, when I have the cataract in my right eye removed!

Space for Shorebirds



Autumn. A time of transition here in Northumberland as the coast begins to fill with birds returning from their summer breeding grounds; most having travelled thousands of miles to call Northumberland their home


Stag Rock is a fantastic place to see shorebirds. The long, gently sloping stretches of whinstone dotted with rockpools and secluded hiding places make this a great area for birds to find food and a sheltered spot to roost. Two special birds which thrive here are turnstone and purple sandpiper. The Northumberland coast supports internationally significant numbers of these birds, with Stag Rock being one of the most important sites for purple sandpiper in the UK.

Both birds are true rocky shore specialists, and now must spend as much time as they can feeding to replenish their energy levels which were depleted during the breeding season and their migration. Maintaining good physical condition is key to surviving a



long winter and this requires access to undisturbed feeding areas.

HospiceCare's short-film 'Bringing Hospice Care Home' has finally gone live. However, thanks to the generosity of retired local BBC Producer, Chris Jackson, who donated his time and professional expertise, they now have a short professionally produced film.

In the film, Nina Burnett, HospiceCare's Clinical Services Manager, has a conversation with Eric, who kindly shares his story of how HospiceCare cared for his wife Marilyn enabling her to die at home with her family - which was her wish. Last year HospiceCare helped over 230 families across North Northumberland enabling over 120 people to die at home, which was their preferred place for end-of-life care.


