Together with almost 100 others, I attended the 2019 Northumberland Celebration of Village Halls on a glorious sunny but frosty day in Stannington Village Hall. What a great inspiring event.

There are over 180 village halls in Northumberland, including 20 Warm Hubs. Seahouses Hub is our equivalent of a village hall and the monthly Fish and Chips Lunch (organised by Seahouses Rotary) has been designated a Warm Hub. I had lunch with Lynne and Angela, representing Beadnell WI Hall, and read a copy of the fascinating booklet "The history of the WI in Beadnell".

Julia Plinston talked about the birth of Community Action Northumberland in 1951 and their initial concentration on village halls, announcing the launch of a Heritage Project in collaboration with Northumberland Archives to ensure that the tons of information about village halls is stored and made available in a variety of ways.

After lots of networking and nattering, Ian McMillan (Radio 3 Presenter, Poet and Village Halls National Ambassador) gave an hilarious talk and, with the help of the audience, created a special poem.

The terrific conclusion, announced by Louise Curry before lunch, was a £420,000.00 grant to Community Action Northumberland from the National Lottery, to be distributed to eleven village halls in Northumberland. Wow! Kelvin Rushworth
